



MONCTON, NEW BRUNSWICK

Located at the geographic centre of Atlantic Canada, Moncton offers events a potential audience of 1.5 million people living within a 2.5-hour drive of the city.

With a population of 71,889¹ and a Census Metropolitan Area population of 144,810², Moncton is the fastest growing urban centre in the Maritimes.

Canada's first officially bilingual city, Moncton is proud of its rich and diverse cultural composition, which includes an important Acadian population that makes up approximately one third of its inhabitants; large English, Irish and Scottish communities; Indigenous people; as well as many ethno-cultural groups from various parts of the world.

Today, a large portion of Monctonians are bilingual, enabling Moncton ability to service events in Canada's both official languages to the highest level.

Strategically Located



Moncton's central location in the heart of the Atlantic Provinces is a definite asset for the organization of large-scale events. Located in Westmorland County, in the southeast of the province of New Brunswick, Moncton is easily accessible from all directions, including from Prince Edward Island, Nova Scotia, Quebec and the New England states.

Access and Transportation

Roméo LeBlanc International Airport:

- Many airlines, including Air Canada, Westjet and Porter, provide daily service between Canada's major airports and the region.
- More than 100 weekly flights offered.
- The airport is less than a 10-minute drive from the city centre.

Moncton is a key transportation hub of the Maritimes.

World-class Regional Sporting Hub



FIFA Women's World Cup Canada 2015[™]

Moncton has earned the title of regional sporting hub, having hosted a number of world-class sporting events including the 2009 Ford World Men's Curling Championships, three regular season CFL games in 2010, 2011 and 2013, the 2012 Canadian Figure Skating Championships, the 2013 Football Canada Cup and the 2013 and 2014 Canadian Senior Track and Field Championships.

Moncton also successfully hosted the IAAF World Junior Track and Field Championships in 2010, welcoming 1500 athletes from 170 countries in world class fashion and earning the honour of having hosted the largest single sporting event in Atlantic Canada to date. The Canadian Sports Tourism Prestige Awards honoured the Moncton 2010 IAAF games as "Canada's International Sport Event of the Year".

Moncton again welcomed the world in 2014 and 2015 as the only Atlantic Canadian City to host the U-20 FIFA Women's World Cup Canada 2014 and the FIFA Women's World Cup Canada 2015[™].

Moncton will once again host the world in 2021 when it will welcome more than 3,000 participants from 55 countries for the World Francophonie Games (Jeux de la Francophonie).

Premier Sporting Venues

Moncton is home to some of the premier event venues in Atlantic Canada. The Moncton Stadium which opened in 2010 has 8,000 permanent seats, and is expandable to 20,000 via temporary seating. The stadium hosts numerous events during the year including university soccer games, various football games, and numerous track and field events. The stadium has also had the Olympic Flame stay there overnight on November 23, 2009 during the torch relay for the 2010 Winter Olympics.

NEW: The newest piece of infrastructure to be added to the city's roster is the state-of-the-art Moncton Events Centre, officially opening this September. The Centre will be a key event venue for the region welcoming sporting, cultural and professional events of a wide variety of size and scope. With a seating capacity of over 9,000 the new Events Centre will be a venue worthy of hosting many prestigious events.

Moncton has developed solid event hosting expertise and experience over the years thanks to its high level of community engagement. There is a strong base of people who enjoy getting involved in large-scale events when they take place in our city, from general volunteers to champions who are willing to play a key volunteer role as part of Local Organizing Committees or other key components of an event.

There is a strong base of dedicated volunteers in Moncton. The City inherited the official database of volunteers from the IAAF World Junior Track and Field Championships in 2010. Today, the database still holds more than 500 trained and certified volunteers. The database has been utilized to engage volunteers for large-scale events held in Moncton such as the FIFA World Women's Cup Canada 2015[™] and several others.

Thanks to the many event experiences offered to them, citizen volunteers and event organizers alike have developed important skills, experience and expertise from which future events will benefit in Moncton.
